GLOBAL FINANCING FACILITY ADOLESCENT AND YOUTH ACTION PLAN

GOAL

A unified group of young people working to see that the Global Financing Facility (GFF) works to advance the health and well-being of adolescents and youth living in GFF countries.

OBJECTIVES

- Involve young people and youth-led organizations in the design, planning, implementation and monitoring of the GFF, including GFF financing decisions
- Build the capacity of youth representatives to participate in policy design, development, implementation and monitoring at all levels
- Leverage existing country-level structures to engage with young people to ensure inclusiveness and accountability
- Strengthen existing adolescent and youth (AY) coalitions to better coordinate with a collective, cohesive voice for advocacy and accountability
- Enhance communication among young people in the GFF at and between the global and country levels, for better alignment and improved implementation at country level
- Leverage social innovations (technology), especially with respect to AY sexual and reproductive health and rights, to
 ensure youth-friendly service delivery and access for adolescents and young people
- Improve private sector engagement in the GFF as it related to AY at country level

- Mapping and coalition building
- Advocacy for youth representation and meaningful engagement at global and country levels
- Capacity building on civic engagement, coalition building, accountability and budget advocacy
- Budget tracking activities and health financing advocacy
