Priorities for action moving forward



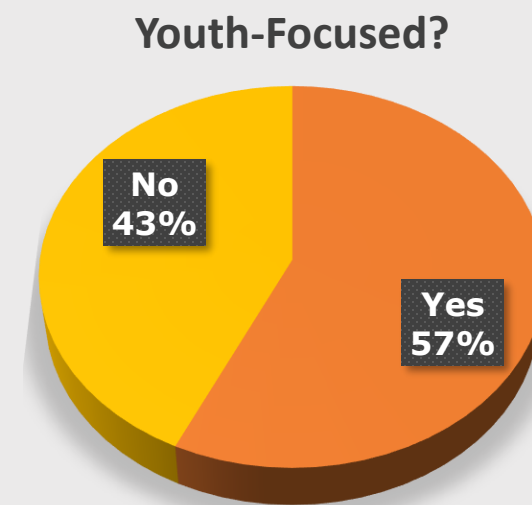
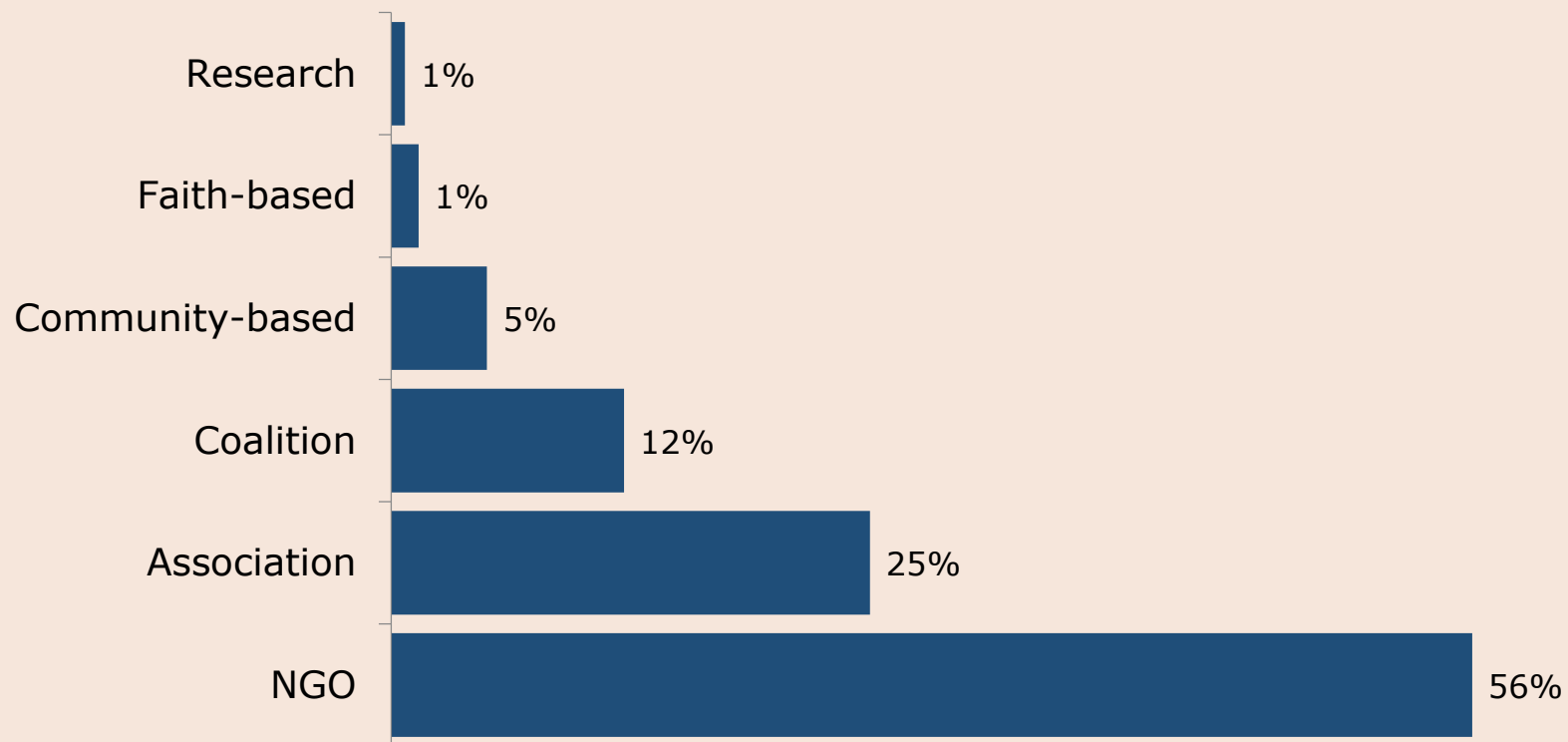

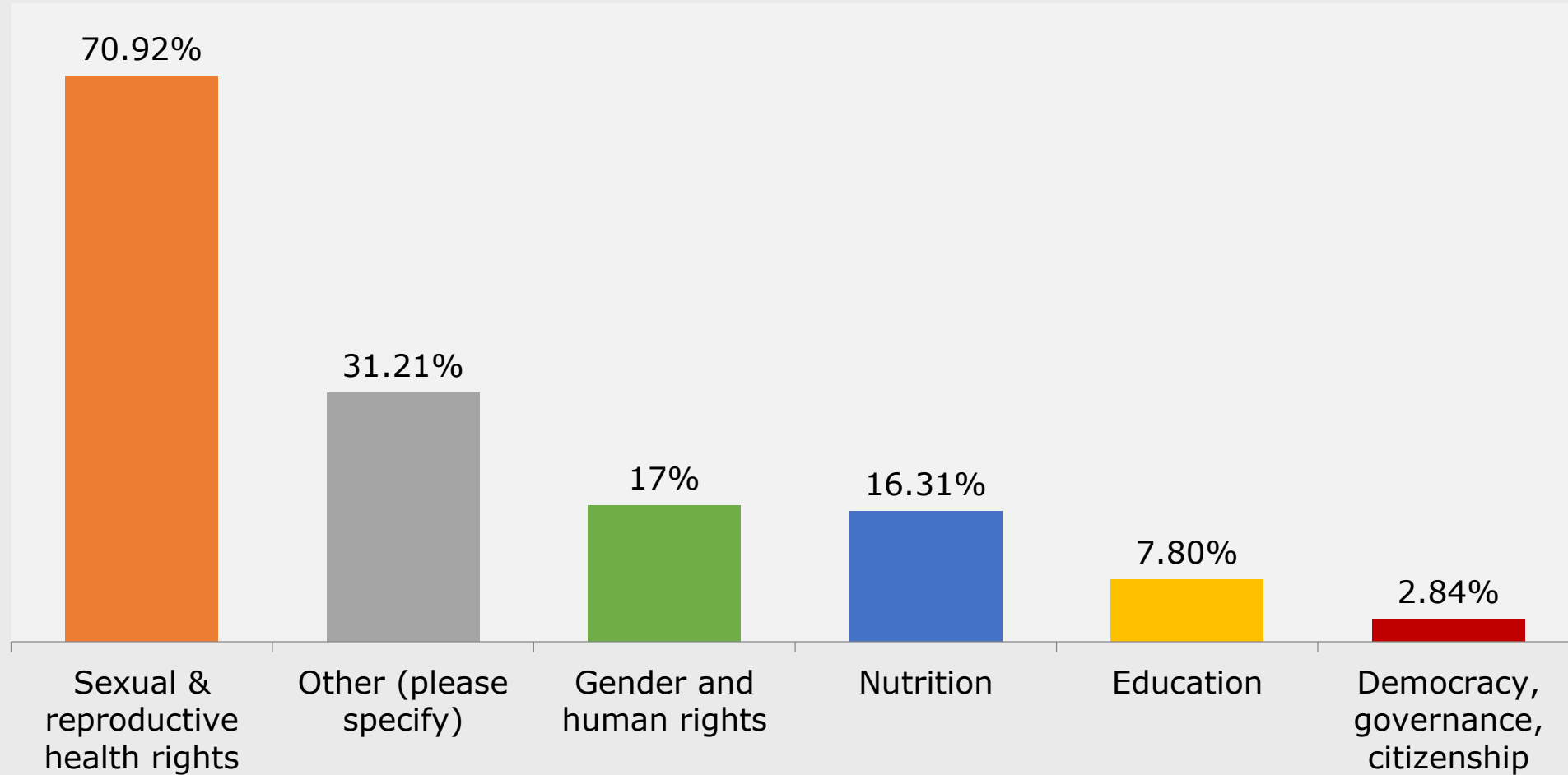

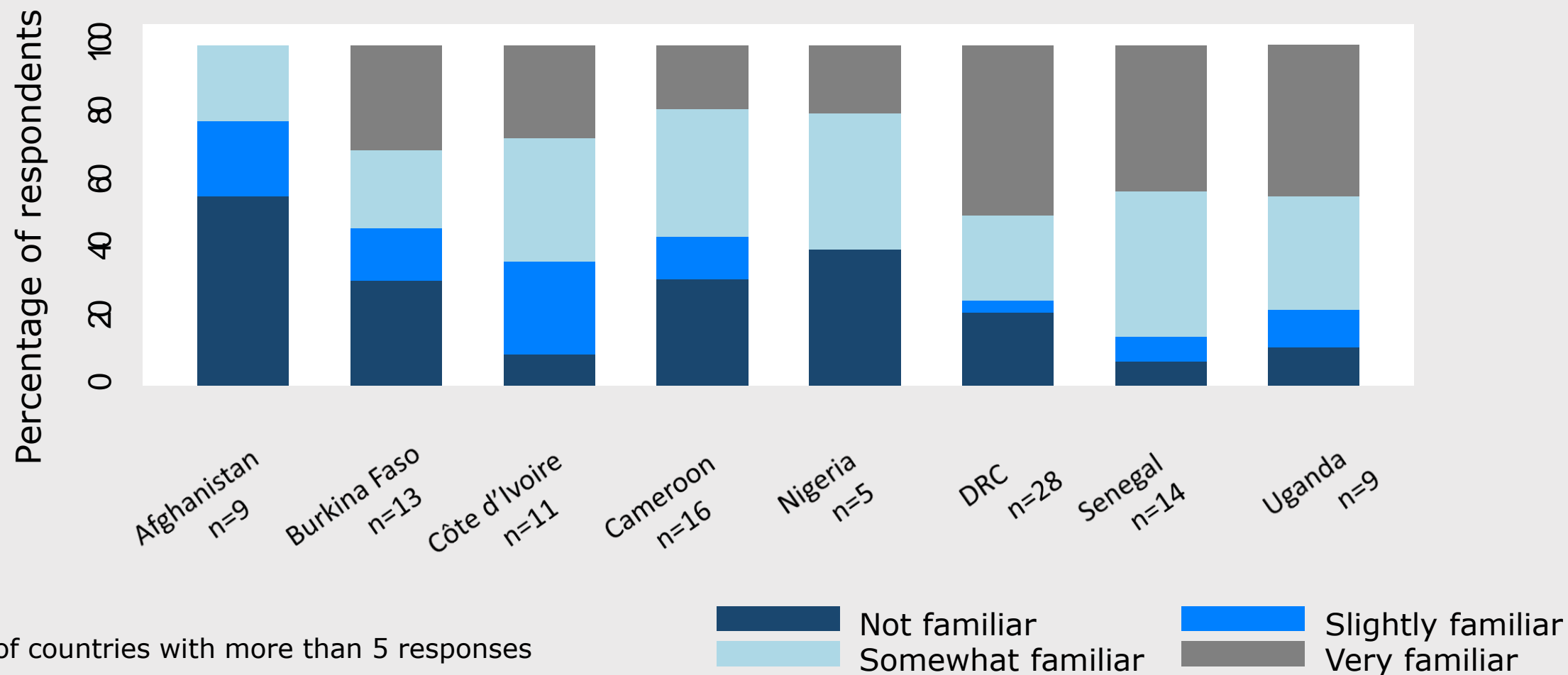
Nature of Organizations



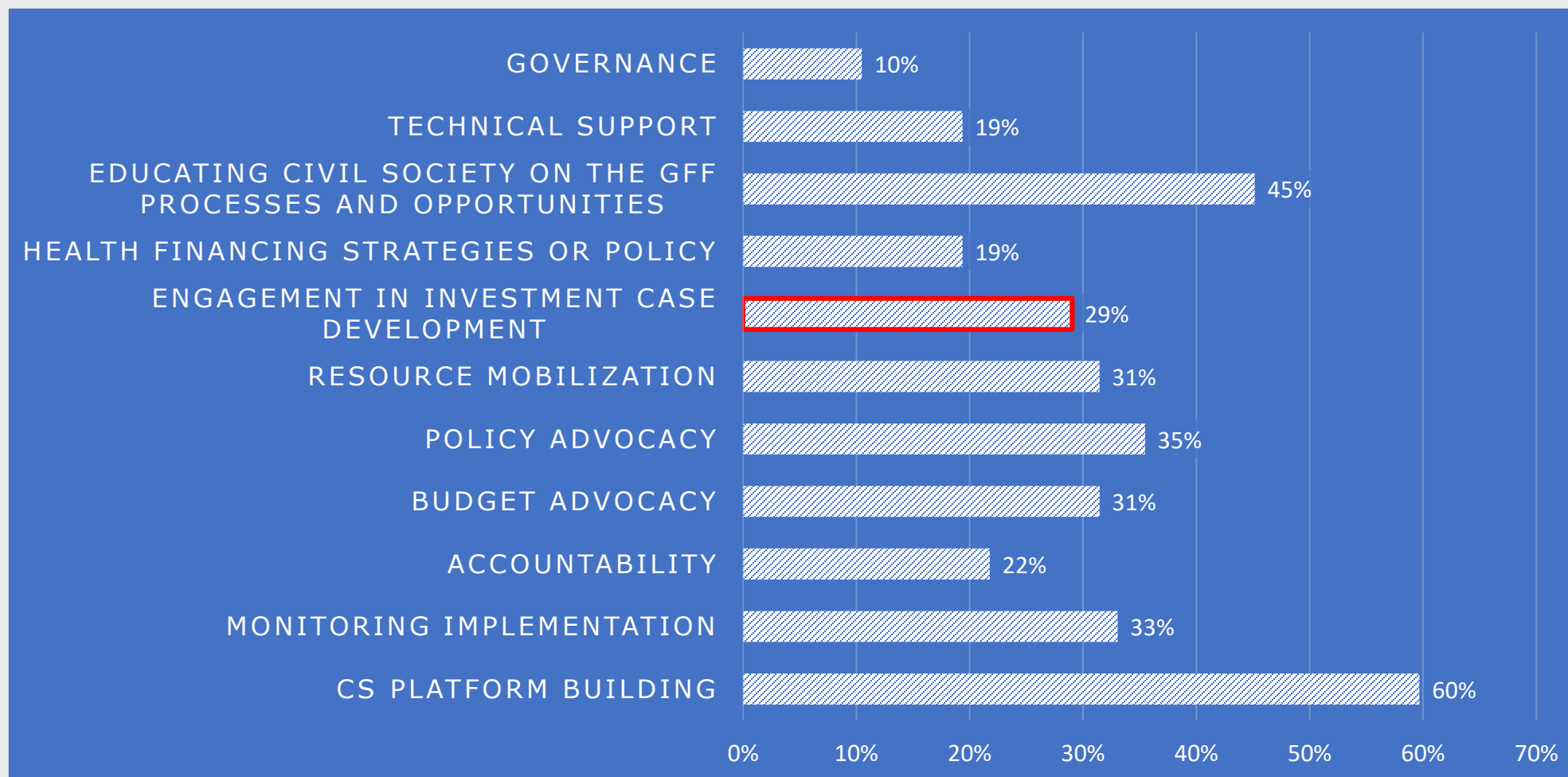
Organizations' Main Activities

Engagement of CS Organizations in the GFF Process



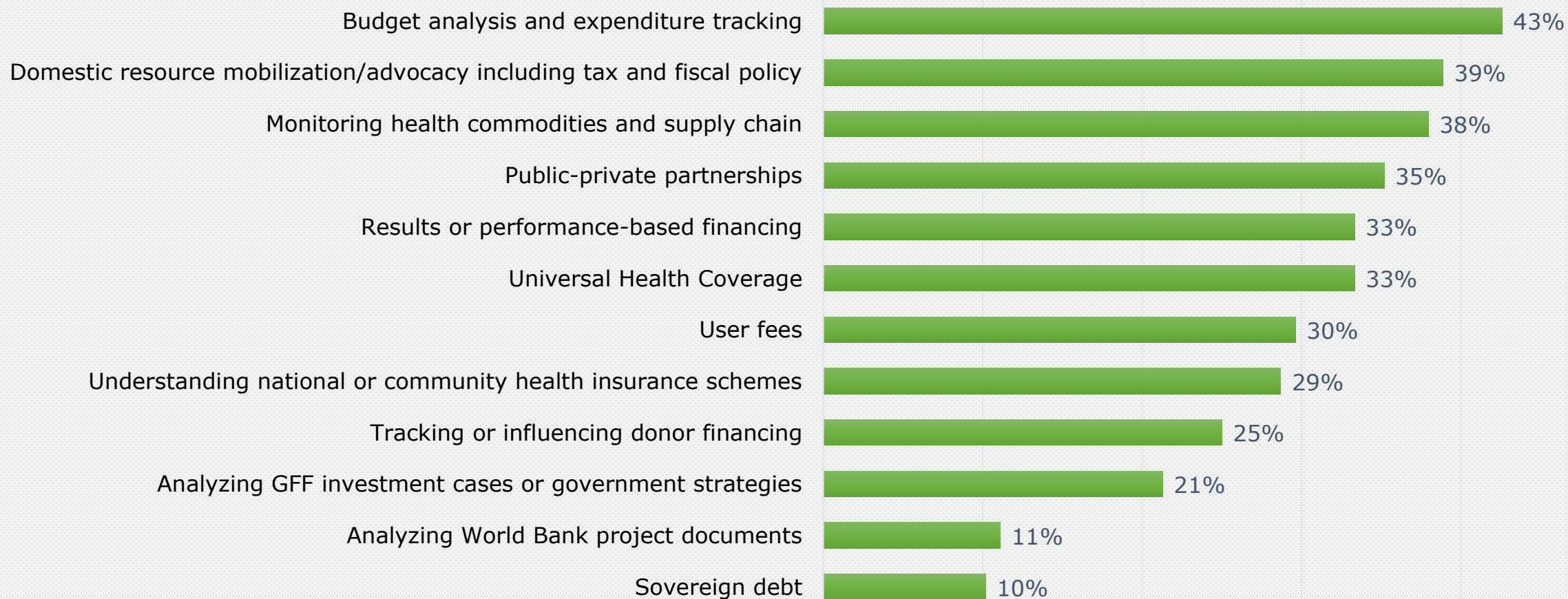
77% of respondents reported CSOs were represented in the country platform



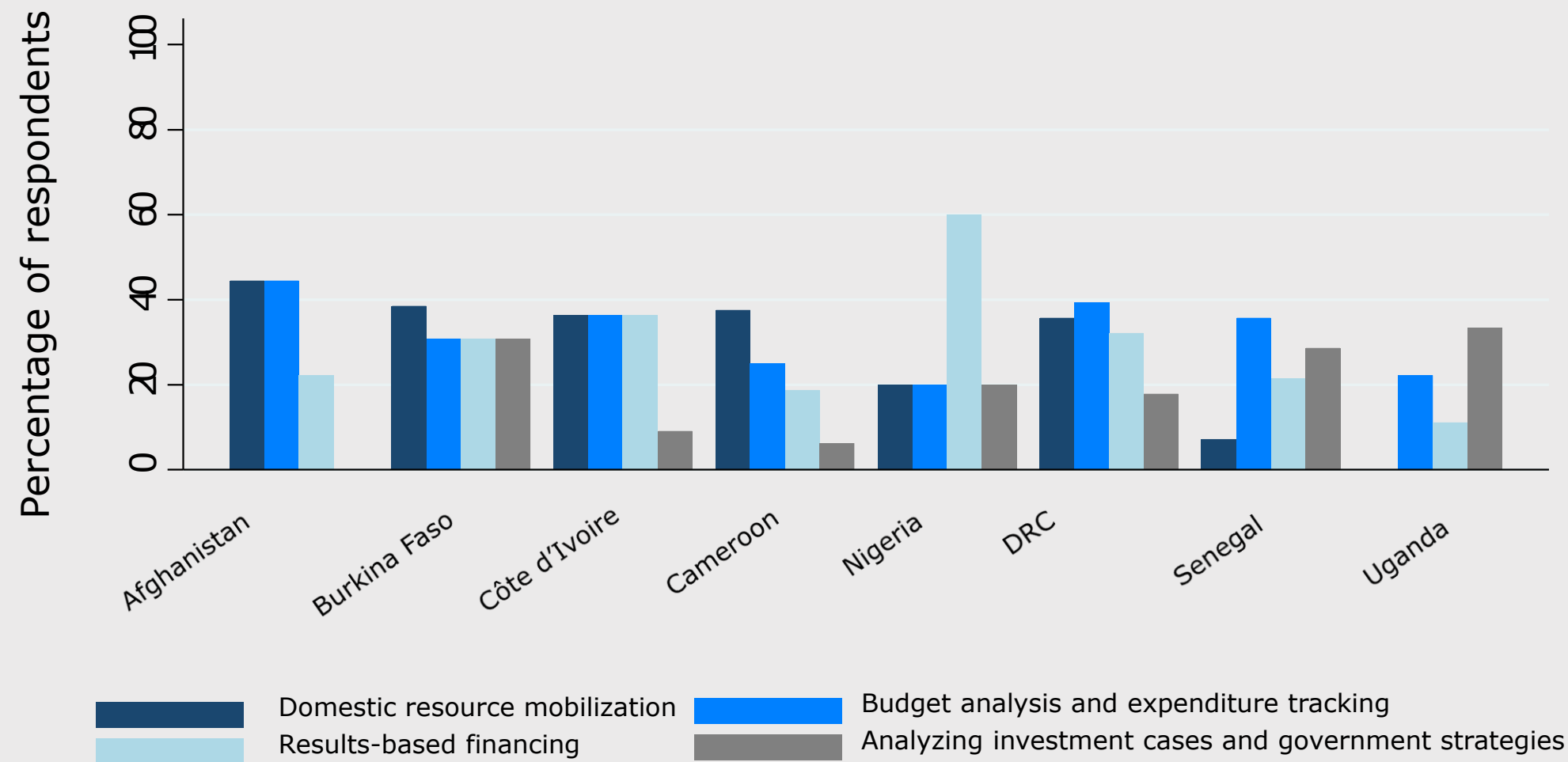

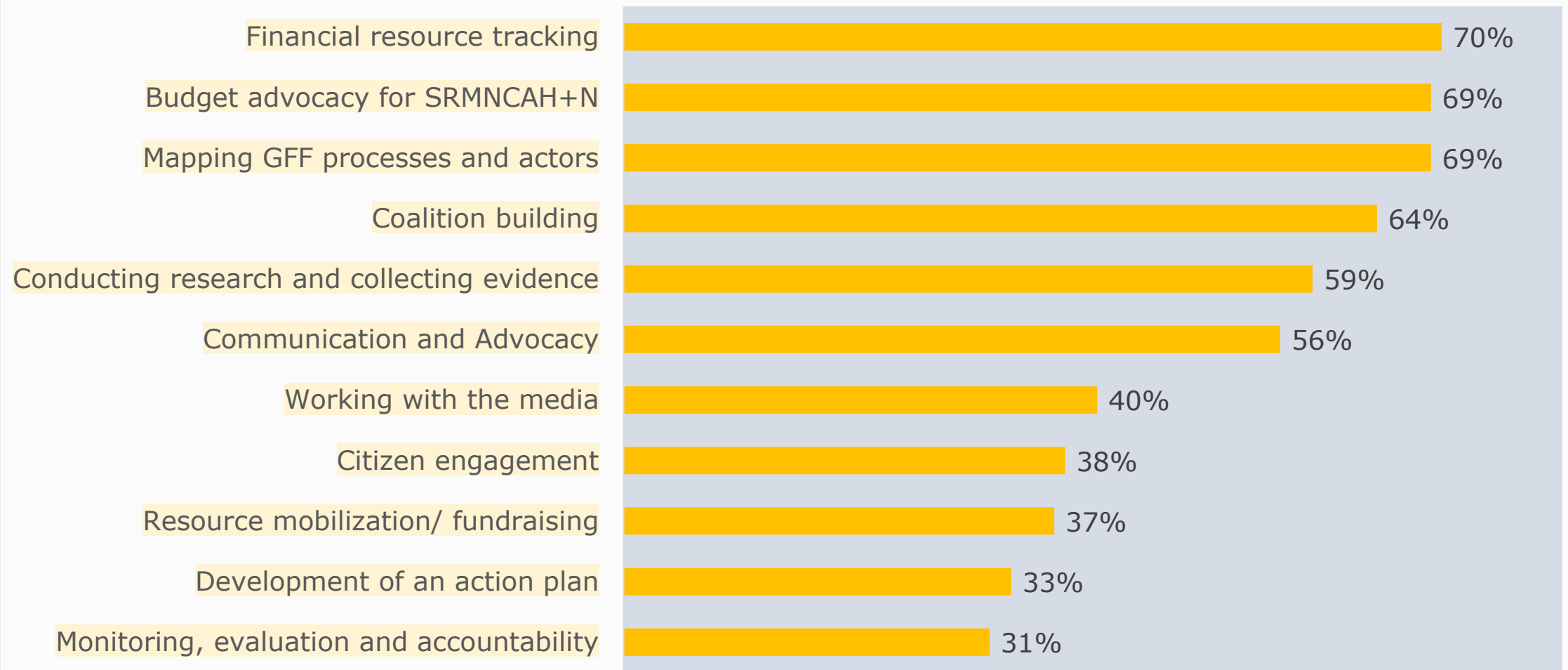


Organizational Knowledge of Health Financing (Continued)



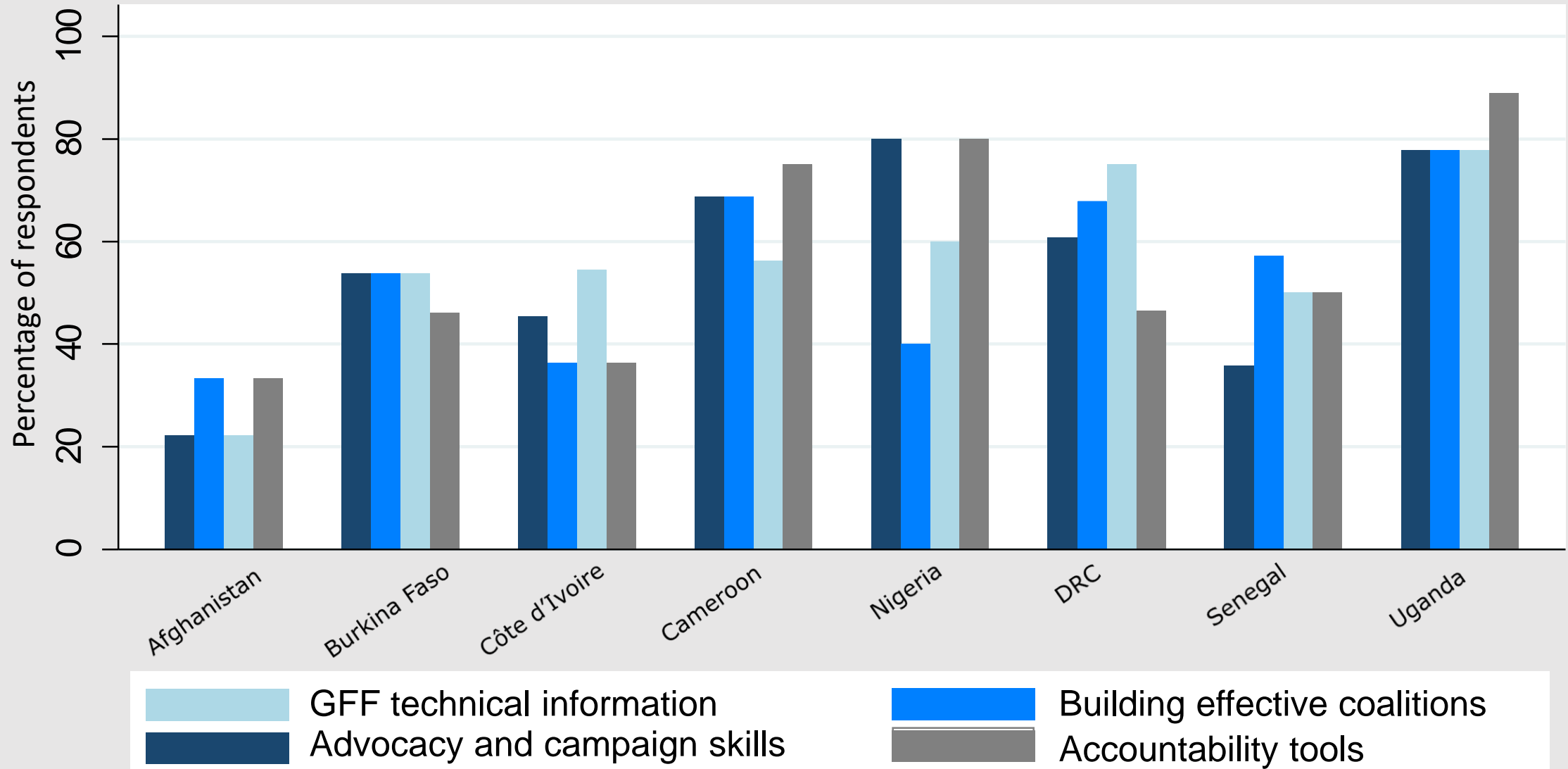

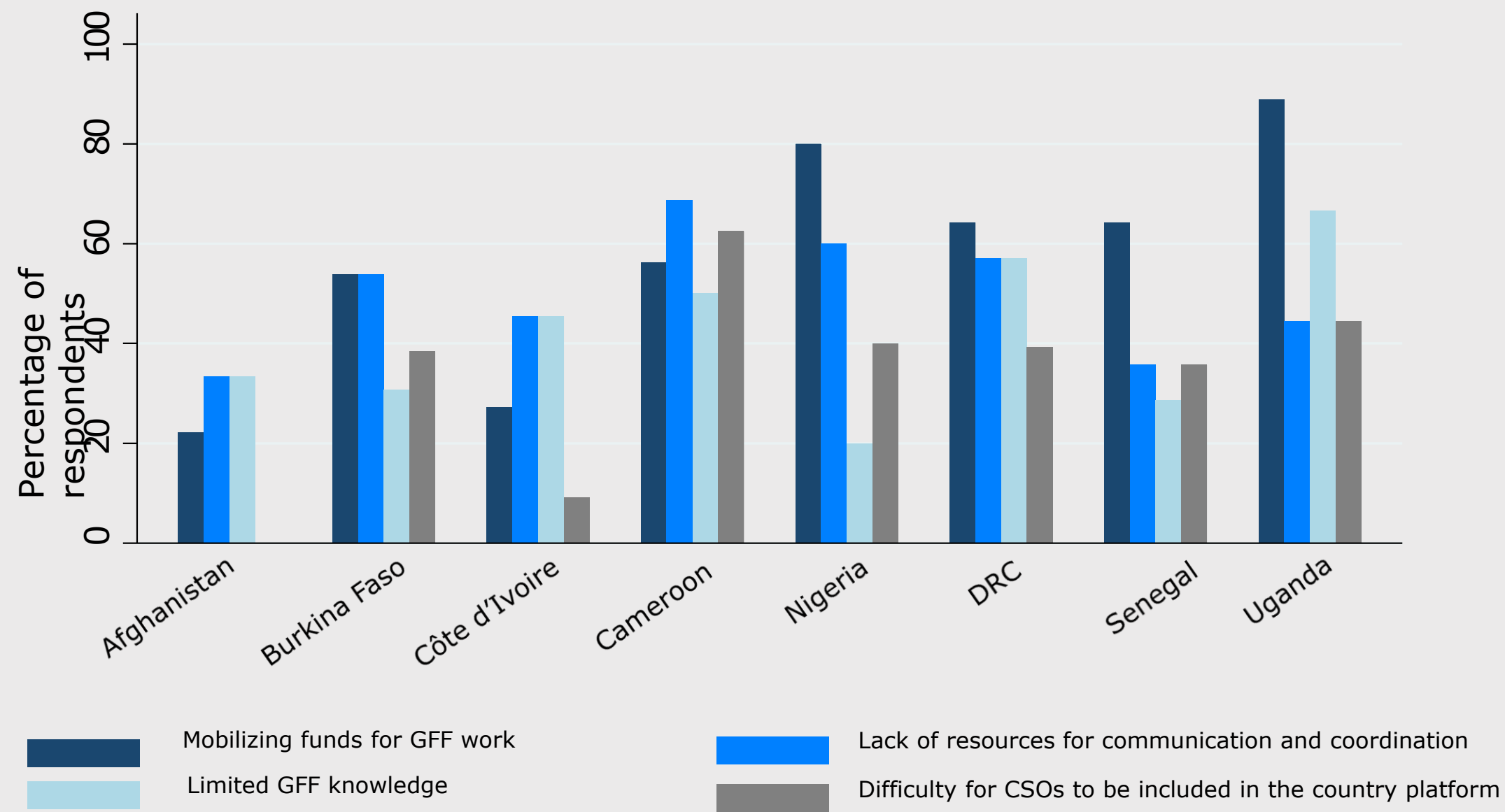

Conclusion and Next Steps

Increase transparency and accountability around the GFF

- Advocate for more transparency and accountability around the GFF multi-stakeholder platforms, the GFF process and actors involved
- Collaborate with GFF liaison officers to better disseminate the GFF country implementation guide

Improve communication and coordination

Support CSO communication and coordinating mechanisms/in-country CSO consultations

Invest in civil society capacity building

- Support CSOs in strengthening their capacities in health financing and budget tracking
- Support GFF Scorecard development and rollout in countries
- Identify local organizations/individuals to increase south-south learning

Funding

- Fund innovative projects for young people with a “results-based” rather than “activities-based” focus
